Please continue to upload your child's work via Microsoft Teams.

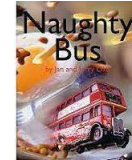
This is the email used to log on for Parents Evening.

Fine Motor Skills

Can you empty a tin of beans into a large bowl or tray and use a cocktail stick, pair of tweezers, chop sticks or your fingers to pick the beans up one at a time and transfer them to another bowl? Challenge time!! How many can you transfer in a minute? Can you beat your grown up?



Gross Motor Skills Session 2 Gymnastics.

Begin by warming up your body with some gentle stretches.
Recap travelling forwards and backwards using your feet.
Use your hands and feet to travel around the room safely for example, crab walking, bunny hop or caterpillar walk. (See resources on Teams)
In Gymnastic routines we have a starting and finishing position. Can you research these and include them in your routine?

Creative Arts and Design

Find some songs or rhymes to sing about transport. Can you make an instrument to play or choreograph a dance routine to go with your song?

For example 'The Wheels on the Bus' and 'Row, row, row your boat' have lots of different versions and actions to go with it!
