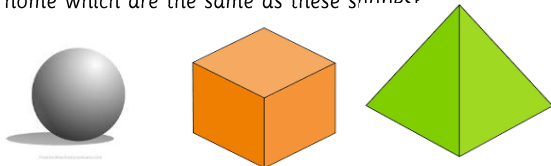


Mathematics

This week we will be learning about 2D shapes and naming a circle, square and triangle. Can you go on a shape hunt around your home and find these shapes? How many can you find? You might spot a shape in wallpaper, a tablecloth or picture.



We will also be looking at 3D shapes (cube, sphere and pyramid) Can you talk to your grown up about how they are different from 2D shapes? They are not flat and we can see all around them! Can you find any objects at home which are the same as these shapes?

Can you play a board game with a family member? It is important to remember to take turns, listen to others and follow instructions. Perhaps you could have a 'Family game night'! Have fun!

Fine Motor Skills

Spiders love to make webs! Can you make your own web using a paper plate, wool and a hole punch. Have a go at threading the wool through the holes to make a web just like a spider!



You can use card, cardboard, string or ribbon if you do not have a paper plate or wool.

We Are Bug Hunters

Here are some home learning tasks to support you and your child whilst they are learning at home. These tasks are in-line with learning that is/would have been taking place in the school. Our topic is 'We are Bug Hunters' and we are also reading the book 'The Very Busy Spider' by Eric Carle along with information books.

As well as these challenges this is an ideal opportunity for children to develop experiences outside of the classroom. Activities such as home baking, gardening, helping around the home, and talking together are all equally as important in developing your child's vocabulary to support their ongoing good progress.

We are really impressed with all the hard work you are completing at home as part of your homework tasks.

On this overview are some ideas for learning this week.

Please adapt and support your child as much or little as you feel they need. Work can be completed on paper or practically. Don't feel you need to print out sheets from the website – these can just be used as ideas and starters for your discussion and as ways to record in your books.

Literacy

This week we will be reading 'The Very Busy Spider' by Eric Carle. You will be able to find a copy on YouTube. Ask your child the following questions in order to develop comprehension skills.

What did the horse invite the spider to do? Why didn't the spider answer? The cow wanted to share her grass, but the spider ignored her – why? What happened when the sheep wanted to run with the spider? The spider did not answer when the animals spoke to her – was she being rude? The goat tried to get the spider's attention – what did he say? What did the pig want the spider to do? Why didn't the spider chase cats with the dog? When it was naptime, who took a nap? What did the spider do? Who wanted to go for a swim with the spider? Who caught the fly? The owl wanted to know who made the web, but got no answer. Why not? Phonics lessons will be allocated to your child using their BugClub account. They will be in line with the phonics lessons for the phase your child is in. You will also be allocated two books for your child's current phonic phase. Please read at least three times per week, answering comprehension questions and completing the BugClub challenges!

Expressive Arts & Design

As we are learning all about spiders this week can you sing the nursery rhyme Incy Wincey Spider and add actions? Do you know any other songs about spiders? Perhaps you can think of your own action song about spiders! Can you make your own spider and web? You could use playdoh, googly eyes, pipe cleaners and wool for the web. You could even paint or draw a spider sitting in a web waiting to catch a fly! Be as creative as you can and have fun!
