This week we will be looking at length and finding things which are taller than/smaller than an object.

Using a pencil can you find things which are taller than the pencil and then smaller than the pencil. Can you find anything which is the same as the pencil? We have assigned a powerpoint in TEAMS to help support your child's learning.

Remember to keep counting forwards and backwards from 0-20 and from random starting and finishing points. Keep working on finding 1 more than/1 less than a given number up to 10 then 20 and have ago at counting in 10's too!

You will also be allocated two books for your child's current phonic phase. Please read at least three times per week, answering comprehension questions and completing the BugClub challenges!
