

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Mathematics</b></p> <p>This week we will be learning about and sequencing the days of the week just like in our story 'The Very Hungry caterpillar'. How many days are there in a week? Can you say each one and count them? Can you remember which day begins the week? Which is the final day of the week? Have a listen to <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3tx0rvuXIRg">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3tx0rvuXIRg</a> which helps us to remember the days of the week. Using the resource in 'Assignments' can you cut out the days of the week and sequence them correctly. Maybe you could draw something which you might do on a certain day.</p> <p>Write your numbers from 0-20 correctly using your numberline to help. Can you make sure there are no reversals and remember to hold your pencil correctly?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>We Are Bug Hunters</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Here are some home learning tasks to support you and your child whilst they are learning at home. These tasks are in-line with learning that is/would have been taking place in the school. Our topic is 'We are Bug Hunters' and we are also reading the book 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>As well as these challenges this is an ideal opportunity for children to develop experiences outside of the classroom. Activities such as home baking, gardening, helping around the home, and talking together are all equally as important in developing your child's vocabulary to support their ongoing good progress.</b></p>		<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Literacy</b></p> <p>Look at the book 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' (online versions can be found on YouTube if you do not have a copy)</p> <p>Can you talk about what the story will be about?</p> <p>What is the name of the mini beast? What happens to the caterpillar? Does he stay the same or does he change? What does he change into?</p> <p>Have a look at the power point in 'Assignments' all about the Lifecycle of a Butterfly. Talk about the different stages and how the caterpillar changes from a tiny egg to a beautiful butterfly. Can you draw your own lifecycle of a butterfly? Have a go at writing a simple sentence or word for each of the different stages.</p>

Have a look at the attached power point all about 'Healthy foods' and why it is important to eat a healthy balance of fruit and vegetables. Can you draw a healthy meal using the plate template in 'Assignments'?
