

Please send any home learning to your class teacher using the Teams task set for the week.</p>	<p><u>Geography (Tuesday)</u></p> <p>Can you name any of the 5 oceans of the World?</p> <p>Watch the video and see if you can find out where each Ocean is.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/z7fq96f</p> <p>Complete the worksheet to label the 5 oceans in the correct place on the World map.</p>	<p><u>RE (Friday)</u> Jesus as a Leader</p> <p>What stories can you remember about Jesus? Why was Jesus a good leader for Christians? What did he do? How did he take care of people around him?</p> <p>Look through the PowerPoint on what makes a good leader.</p> <p>Draw a picture of someone you think is a good leader. Next to your picture write down the characteristics which makes them that good leader.</p>	<p><u>Computing (Monday)</u></p> <p>In Science last week, we created different questions about what we would like to find out about plants.</p> <p>Your mission over the next few weeks is to create a PowerPoint presentation on plants.</p> <p>Today's task is to use a child's search engine such as Kiddle to begin to answer some of those questions. Make sure you only use reliable sources and you read more than 1 article to ensure the answer you receive is accurate.</p> <p>Make a note of the information you find to use in next week's lesson.</p>

Science (Wednesday)

As part of our plant topic, go into your garden and see if you can name the different plants within it. Download a plant identifying app to support identification. Then look carefully. How do the plants differ from each other? How in the future will you be able to identify that plant? Is it the shape of the leaf, the colour of the flower or the height of the plant?

Take some photographs and begin your own scrapbook making notes on ways to identify the different plants.

PE (Tuesday and Thursday)

Active Athletics

Warm-up: move around like different animals: stomp like an elephant, creep like a tiger, run like a mouse. What other animals can you think of?

Skill development: Run with agility and confidence.

In your garden, run in different directions to different items in your garden. Can you change direction quickly? Repeat moving in different ways such as skipping, hopping, jumping, hopscotch. Do the different movements affect your speed and agility? Now try to do each action with your hands straight up in the air. How does this affect your agility?

Application: Place two items at opposite ends of your garden. With a 30 second timer, how many times can you run and touch the items in the 30 seconds. If you have family at home with you see if they can beat your score. Have a rest and repeat. Can you beat your original score?
