


Reception Online Learning Tasks 13.4.2021

<p style="text-align: center;">Mathematics</p> <p>Can you complete the following activities?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Count forward and backwards from 0-10, 0-20 and back again. Count out 10 objects from a group and remember to touch count accurately. Find 1 more than a number up to 10 and write the equation or draw it. For example $4+1=5$. Can you think of different ways to write the equation? $1+4=5$, $5 = 1+4$ Find 1 less than a number up to 10 and write the equation or draw it. $4 - 1=3$. Remember when we take away we cannot 'switch' the number equation. 	<h1 style="color: red;">We Are Kind</h1> <p>Here are some home learning tasks to support you and your child whilst they are learning at home. These tasks are in line with learning that is/would have been taking place in school.</p> <p>Our topic is 'We are Kind' and we will be looking at 'Silly Doggy' by Adam Stower</p>		<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy</p> <p>We are beginning our work based on the story of 'Silly Doggy' by Adam Stower.</p>  <p>Look at the front cover and talk to your child about what they can see. Encourage your child to use full sentences rather than just one word for example 'I can see a little girl holding a scarf'. 'I think it is a bear with the little girl'. Ask your child lots of questions such as - What do you think the girl is called? Why is she holding a bear? What is she using as a lead? Use lots of questions in order to develop your child's comprehension skills.</p> <p>Phonics lessons will be allocated to your child using their BugClub account. They will be in line with the phonics lessons for the phase your child is in. You will also be allocated two books for your child's current phonic phase. Please read at least three times per week, answering comprehension questions and completing the BugClub challenges!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PSED</p> <p>This week we will be talking about the importance of staying safe whilst we are in a different environment such as a shopping centre. Have a look at the Assignment 'Blue Dilemma Drop' and talk to your grown up what you would do if you became lost and who you would ask for help. Remember our previous topic 'We are Real Life Heroes' and who might help us.</p>	<p>We are really impressed with all the hard work you are completing at home as part of your homework tasks.</p> <p>On this overview are some ideas for learning this week.</p> <p>Please adapt and support your child as much or little as you feel they need. Work can be completed on paper or practically. Don't feel you need to print out sheets from the website – these can just be used as ideas and starters for your discussion and ways to record in your books.</p> <p>Please continue to upload completed work to TEAMS.</p> 		
<p style="text-align: center;">Fine Motor Skills/Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>Using the template in Assignments can you make your own pet using split pins? This activity will support your child's development in joining techniques. Remember to hold your scissors correctly and cut carefully along the lines. Then using split pins join in each piece together so that they are moving parts. If you don't have a split pin what else could you use? Be creative and have fun!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Gross Motor Skills</p> <p>We will be developing our throwing and catching skills this term.</p> <p>Warm up – hop on one foot x 10 then swap feet and repeat. Jump up and down x 20. Jog on the spot for 30 secs then a minute.</p> <p>Activity – Throw a ball high, low, forward, backward. Can you throw with both hands, left hand, right hand? Now throw your object at a target. This could be a tin can, hoop, empty bottle. Count how many times you hit the target.</p> <p>Cool down – Stretch up to the sky then down to your toes x 5, Breathe in and out slowly x 5</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Understanding the World</p> <p>We will be discovering all about the types of animals which are suitable for pets. Do you have a pet or would you like a pet? Discuss with your grown up how a pet is looked after such as a dog must be taken for a walk and eats dog food. A fish lives in water and eats special food. Share the powerpoint in Assignments 'How to look after a pet' and discuss how the pets are cared for differently as they have different needs. Would we be able to have an elephant as a pet? No, Why? Talk about which animals may good pets and those that wouldn't due to size, shape etc.</p>	
			

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
