Can you complete the following activities? You will need a set of number cards up to 20 and a set of counting objects up to 20 along with a number line.

- Count up to 20 and back again to 0.
- Count in 10's up to 100 and back again to 0.
- Count an amount of objects and then count on 2 more or 3 more. What is happening to your set of objects? Is it getting bigger or smaller?

Write your numbers to 20 using your number line to help you make sure each number is the correct way round !

Literacy

Will the evil pea be captured? Will Supertato come to the rescue? How do you think our story will end? Talk to your grown up and using full sentences with a clear voice tell your own story ending.

Can you draw 'Supertato' and label him? Can you write sentences using your phonic knowledge to describe what he is like? Use your tricky words too.

He is big and strong. The evil pea has been trapped.



Phonics lessons will be allocated to your child using their BugClub account. They will be in line with the phonics lessons for the phase your child is in. You will also be allocated two books for your child's current phonic phase. Please read at least three times per week, answering comprehension questions and completing the BugClub challenges!

Gross Motor Skills

1. Using your piece of striking equipment can you take a ball for a walk like last week.
2. Make a goal using two cones or any other equipment which you may have to make a goal.
3. Stand away from your goal and using your striking equipment, hit the ball into the goal.
4. Move a space backwards each time you get a goal!
5. Keep a total of your goals.

You could use junk model making materials such as empty cardboard boxes, rolls and plastic containers/lids.
