Now that you have shared and read the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' with your grown up can you talk about whether you think Jack made the right or wrong choice when he left the castle? Should Jack have taken the golden harp or should he have left it? How did the Giant feel? Was he happy or sad? How would you feel if somebody took your things? Talk to your grown up about the importance of making the right choices.

Please continue to upload completed work to TEAMS.




Expressive Arts and Design 1

Design a castle remembering to add lots of detail such as turrets, flag and drawbridge. Then make your own castle using a range of materials such as empty cardboard boxes, pots and tubes. Think about how you will join your materials together and what you will use such as glue, masking tape or sellotape.




Expressive Arts and Design 2

We will be making a painting of a castle using the printing technique. Firstly draw a large outline of a castle. Then mix black/white paint to make a shade of grey. Using a sponge or small wooden block, print brick patterns within the outline to make your own castle.



Literacy

Share the traditional tale 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and talk about the characters in the story along with the main events. Can you role play the story? Ask grown ups and siblings to join in too! We will be studying the character of Jack. Can you think of words to describe Jack? – quick, fast, tall, kind etc. Then use these describing words in a sentence – Jack is quick and tall. Remember to use your phonic knowledge, punctuation and finger spaces.



Phonics lessons will be allocated to your child using their BugClub account. They will be in line with the phonics lessons for the phase your child is in. You will also be allocated two books for your child's current phonic phase. Please read at least three times per week, answering comprehension questions and completing the BugClub challenges!

Understanding the World

Remembering our eSafety rules can you use Google in order to find out information about Castles. Look at what they looked like in the past and what they look like now. Who lived in a castle? Do people still live in castles now? How have they changed over time? Share the powerpoint in **Assignments** and write a simple fact about a castle which you have now discovered.
