This week we have had a visit from a very cheeky Gingerbread Man! We arrived to school on Monday morning to find footprints along the corridor which were made from flour. We then had a tray of ingredients left for us with a recipe which we followed and made gingerbread biscuits. In the afternoon, the children tasted the biscuits (courtesy of Sainsburys in order to stay Covid safe) and discussed what happened to the dough after it had been baked in the oven. The children used words such as hard, brown, crunchy and spicy to describe the biscuits. The Gingerbread Man left us a video on our class iPad of him exploring the classroom whilst we were all at home tucked up in bed! We thought it would be a good idea to warn the rest of the school that the Gingerbread Man was on the loose so we made posters which we put up around the school.
