

## Reception Remote Learning Autumn 2 Week 1

Literacy	Maths	PSED
<p>Explain to the children that this half term we will be reading 'Stanley's Stick' Show the children the pictures of the front cover and read the title.</p>  <p>Looking at the image on the front cover, predict what might happen in the story. What do they think is going to happen in this story? Together, create a story pathway. What will happen at the beginning, middle and end? You can scribe your child's ideas and send them to the learning selfie page.</p>	<p>This week we are focusing on counting one to one correspondence to five. We are focusing on our counting top tips</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Putting the objects in a straight line so there is a definite start and end point.</li> <li>• Counting slowly and carefully</li> <li>• Saying one number name as we touch each object</li> <li>• Knowing the total amount of objects is the last number that we say.</li> </ul> <p>Can you practise counting some different objects up to five around your house. Encourage children to talk about the top tips as they do it. Also have a look on the website at last half terms floor book and ask your children to talk about what they have been up to.</p>	<p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9IhhCq44ar8">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9IhhCq44ar8</a></p> <p>This week we have been talking about what to do if we are worried. Watch the story above 'Ruby's worry' and talk with your child about who they can talk to in school and at home if they are worried.</p> <p>We have also talked about how important it is to eat healthily. Can you discuss with children how making the right food choices help us to keep healthy both physically and mentally?</p>

<p>Share the PowerPoint with the children and discuss Diwali and how it is a special event which is celebrated by Hindu's. Talk about how it is known as the 'Festival of Light' and why it has this special name. Discuss how different cultures have different celebrations. Talk about the celebrations the children have experienced such as a birthday, wedding, Christmas etc.</p> <p>Can you make some Rangoli patterns? Maybe you could use chalks on a floor? Or paint on paper? However, you would like to do it! Don't forget to send us your photos.</p>	<p>Ask children if they know of a celebration that is coming up soon. Introduce 'Bonfire Night' as a special celebration as part of our tradition from a long time ago. Look at the PowerPoint of 'Guy Fawkes' using historical vocab of past/present. Talk about how Guy Fawkes is a historical figure from the past and we still remember him many years later in the present by lighting bonfires/fireworks.</p> <p>Share PowerPoint with children 'Bonfire Night'. Talk to children about what they see, hear, smell on Bonfire night – loud noises, bangs, colourful lights, smoke. Ask the children how we would keep safe and develop their suggestions further by teaching ways to keep safe.</p>	<p>Share a firework display video such as <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oe-8QopJn9k">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oe-8QopJn9k</a></p> <p>Talk to children about what they can see/hear and link to prior knowledge of senses from school Nursery. Discuss the colours and patterns which they can see in the night sky. Introduce activity to children explaining that they will be making a firework picture using pastels for the fireworks on black paper for the night sky. You could also encourage your child to explore movement whilst watching the fireworks.</p>
