



Reception Remote Learning Autumn 2 13/12/21

Literacy	Maths
<p>This week we are continuing our work on poetry. We will be learning another poem entitled 'Winter' and we shall perform it to our class mates. Could your child learn the following poem and then film it and send it to us via your class email? Remember to use a loud clear voice and talk about adding expression whilst we speak.</p> <p>The street cars are like frosted cakes</p> <p>All covered up with cold snowflakes.</p> <p>The horses' hoofs scrunch on the street</p> <p>Their eyelashes are white with sleet.</p> <p>And everywhere the people go</p> <p>With faces TICKLED by the snow</p> <p>Dorothy Aldi</p> <p>What is the poem about? Do you think this is a poem about winter. why? How does it make you feel? Discuss the vocabulary with your child – street car, frosted, scrunch, sleet. Talk about how they might have been chosen because of the way they sound, make you feel cold.</p>	<p>Activity 1</p> <p>Show your child 2 squares of orange paper or card. Ask your child if they can guess who it might be. Is Numberblock 2 made up of different parts? How can you describe the parts that Two is made up of? So 1 is a part, and another 1 is a part, and the whole makes Two.</p> <p>Is there another way to show the parts that Two is made of? Allow time for your child to explore composing and de-composing of the 2 tiles/squares. What's the same and what's different to the other ways?</p> <p>Show your child 3 squares of yellow card or paper. Is Numberblock Three made up of different parts? Generate a discussion with your child about the different parts that make Three. Are the parts of Three always the same? Is the whole still Three?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Activity 2</p> <p>Explain to your child that you are going to explore movement today and that they are going to pretend they are a robot. The robot can only move when given a set of instructions. Be sure to include the language of make a full turn. Talk about what a full turn is- when you turn all the way round and face the same way you started. Can your child be directed to a toy that you have left out.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">People and Communities</p> <p>This week we are discovering how Christmas is celebrated around the World and we will be looking at China. Here are some facts to share with your child.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Christians in China often celebrate by lighting their houses with paper lanterns. * Christmas trees are called 'trees of light' and are decorated with paper chains, paper flowers and paper lanterns. * Lots of people in China do not celebrate Christmas. The main winter festival is called Chinese New Year and takes place in February.
